We issue a State License to provide temporary care for children that have been removed from their biological families for abuse and neglect.

What is Foster Care?

Definition of *foster care*: a situation in which, for a period, a child lives with and is cared for by people who are not the child's biological parents.

While in Foster Care, a child may live with relatives, foster families, or group facilities

The goal for a child in Foster Care is usually reunification with biological family but may be changed to adoption when this is seen in the child's best interest by the Court system

 Foster Care is Temporary, and Adoption is Permanent



- The foster care system is in a crisis. Children in care are spending nights sleeping in CPS offices or shelters due to the lack of foster homes
- It takes a special person to open their heart to be able to care for foster children
- You can make a difference in the time a child spends in your home; they are safe, loved, and guided
- As a foster parent you are creating a new pathway for children, biological families, and future generations

What Types of Children Would I Have in My Home?



- Most come from parents who abused and/or neglected them
- Many children have behavior problems
- Many children feel unwanted and have emotional problems like depression, anxiety, PTSD, learning disabilities
- Often children must go through different foster families which makes it difficult to develop bonds and trust in family values
- ► Children come from many different backgrounds. It is not the child's fault that their parents could not take care of them or that they experienced abuse. But, because they had these experiences, many have resorted to negative behaviors to deal with their problems and most people are not willing to take them into their homes. This usually causes low self esteem in the children and often leads to more behavior problems as a cry for help

Children have different needs....

Children with Basic needs or Therapeutic needs.

Basic needs: Children needing basic and essential support from a family setting.

Therapeutic needs: Children who may have emotional or psychological difficulties and need added support and structure.



What Ages of Children Would Have in My Home?

- Ages range from infant to 17
- We will work with you to find an age range that suits your abilities
- Young adults, pregnant teens, medical fragile children

We're committed to finding the best fit for the child and you.

Can I Be A Foster Parent?

- Do you have a heart for children?
- Do you have a high school diploma/ GED or show competencies in basic areas?
- Are you mature, healthy and capable of meeting a child's needs?
- Do you have a clear criminal history?
- Do you have reliable transportation & driver's license?
- Do you handle stress well?
- The essence of being a foster parent is the unselfish giving to a child in need by providing a family environment to him or her.
- This includes nurturing, teaching, hugging, re-directing, listening, showing, prompting, disciplining, talking, sharing, holding, playing, reading, creating, imparting, growing, blessing, comforting, LOVING.



Eligibility to Become a Foster/Adoptive Family:

- At least 21 years of age
- No Criminal History or History of Abuse
- Valid Texas Driver's License
- Home Inspection Approval
- Solid emotional and physical Health
- Regular Source of Income
- Approved Home Study



What Training Do I Need?





Infant/Child CPR & First Aid • Behavior Intervention Medication Training • TBRI • Policy & Procedures

Basic Certified Homes. 30 Hours of Training each year

<u>Therapeutic Foster Homes</u>. 50 Hours of Training each year for single caregivers, or 30 hours per caregiver if there are two caregivers in the home.



25% through self-study

BCFY provides opportunities for all required training

A Home Study will be completed by BCFY

- A criminal history, including FBI fingerprinting, will be completed prior to verification
- You will be asked to provide birth certificates, marriage certificates (only if married), auto insurance, a current TB test for all members of your home, etc. (a list will be provided)
- You will be asked about your childhood, health, significant relationships, past experiences of loss and motivation for fostering
- We must also verify your home meets the square footage requirements



How Are Children Placed in My Home After I Become a Foster Parent?



After you are a licensed home, as children are referred to our agency, we will contact you if we think there would be a good fit for the child and you.



If you are interested, you would be able to read the child's history to determine if you could meet the child's needs.
